Southern and National Road Relays

First competitive event of the winter season was the Southern Road Relay Championship at Aldershot on 20 September, with our teams now entered as Wells City Harriers, but with many familiar names appearing in these different colours.

YOAC members featured strongly in all the junior races on the Saturday, with all those who had appeared in this event before knocking substantial chunks of time off their previous bests on this course. Getting there in the first place had its problems, however. Amy D'Arcy and Harrison Jones were both stung by hornets when walking through the park towards the race area, Harrison badly enough that he wasn't able to run later!

Our best-performing team was the U15 girls (Caitlin Carnegie, Elise Thorner and Sophie Hamilton, *pictured right, LtoR*) who won bronze, from an entry of 101 teams. The U13 Girls (*below right*) were as enthusiastic as ever and the U17 Men also had plenty to celebrate with a 5th place finish.

Following their strong performances in the Southern Championship the U15 Girls and U17 Men were chosen to go forward to the National Championship at Birmingham's Sutton Park on Sunday 5 October. Oliver Dickinson unfortunately missed out when the U17 team was cut from 4 members to 3.

Both teams recorded impressive performances on this tough 3.86km hilly circuit. In the U15G Caitlin ran 14:48 for 21st position. Elise ran 14:20 to bring us through to 8th and Sophie ran 14:04 seconds (3rd fastest on her leg and 8th fastest on the day) to finish in 6th place overall. In the U17 Men's race the team of Luke Prior, Felix Rusby and Sam Sommerville (*pictured right, LtoR*) achieved a very creditable 12th place finish, with Sam running the fastest of the team's legs in 12.25.

Officials' Course

Qualified officials are obviously essential if our athletes are to compete and the club is obliged to supply officials to many of the competitions our teams participate in.

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Combined Events

Yeovil and Well members enjoyed welldeserved successes at the English Schools Combined Events Championships at Boston, Lincolnshire, last month.

In the Inter Girls Heptathlon, Ellen Barber scored a points PB of 4,775 and individual PBs in four of the seven events, and was rewarded with a bronze medal (*below*) and selection to represent England at the home international in Glasgow in December.

In the Inter Boys Octathlon Matt Trickey (right) was unable to replicate his PB from June of 4,949 which saw him achieve eighth place in the SW all-time rankings. He finished the competition in sixth place individually but won a podium place with the Somerset IB team who finished third.

In the Junior Boys pentathlon Ollie Thorner (*below right, 36*) finished with a new PB of 2,275 in 26th position individually. Scoring new PBs in long jump and shot, he helped the Somerset junior boys team to third place in the team event.

Exeter Combined Events Meeting

After a disappointing fall in the schools championship earlier in the season, Lauren Rousell was only able to reach 18th place. She was determined to get a more accurate score and entered the Exeter combined events and came away with a very well-deserved first place (*bottom right, holding trophy*) and a total of 2,721 points – a great way to end the season.





SW Athletics Team, Belgium

Three YOAC members proudly represented the South West Athletics team at the International Antwerp Athletic Gala in Merksem, Belgium on 23 August. Ben Gibb competed in the javelin and 100m, Ben Thompson competed in the javelin and won the 110m hurdles and Lewis Guest competed in the 100m and finished second in the triple jump with a personal best and new YOAC club record of 14.29m. The team, managed by Sonia Ellis, had a successful trip and a good time was had by all!







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
